I've never gotten such cheerful, helpful assistance. They made carting me around look easy, even though I know it couldn't have been.

Juan arranged for us to go snorkeling at Kicker Rock on a catamaran. The guides made transferring from the dock to the boat safe and easy. We had good equipment, wetsuits and snorkling gear for the whole week. The catamaran was wide open and very comfortable. There were abundant sea turtles and some small black tip sharks.
